

**“Free to Choose”*****Deuteronomy 30:15-20*****Introduction**

Our consequences are ultimately influenced by the decisions we make. We get to decide whether we experience blessings or curses in our lives based on the choices we make. Choice is a freedom given to man by God. It involves deciding between God’s way and competing alternatives that at times may seem more logical, more enjoyable, or less difficult. But our choices determine our alignment with God’s covenant.

Our choices affect our experiences in this life. How we choose determines whether we experience good or evil and how much of it we experience. Our choices affect whether we experience blessing or cursing. And in the end, our choices determine whether or not we experience life or death.

What’s important to know is that God desires for us to choose Him. He desires that we choose His way, as His way is always best. Our choice involves our trust of God, our love for God, and our decision to obey God and to take Him at His Word.
