

COMMIT

For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake, he is the one who will save it. - Luke 9:24

CONSIDER

We are now coming to our final church the Church of Laodicea. Laodicea can best be described as an inauthentic church. It was comprised of people who were in it for themselves. The wealth in this community flowed, clothing was made and hospitals thrived with the latest techniques and advances in medicine, but true spirituality languished in the background of so-called more important material pursuits. This church wore a façade of what it meant to be a Christian authentically committed to Jesus Christ. They had the right externals-looked good, spoke well and raised their hands in worship, but they had the wrong internal motivation, conviction and authenticity. This neither hot nor cold church didn't make our Savior shrug His shoulders or turn His head in disappointment. The church of Laodicea made Him want to "spew" them right out of His mouth.

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CONNECT

Remember to always open your group time together in prayer. Invite God's Spirit to manifest Himself fully in your midst, to soften your hearts and open your ears to His Word as well as to guard your lips—seasoning each person's speech as with salt. Keep specific prayer requests to be covered at the end of the meeting, if possible. This is a time to connect with each other and to connect with God as we open our time together.

What would you say has been the greatest benefit or principle you have gleaned from this study?

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What are some of the things you have started to apply to your life as a result of this study?

Day 2

REFLECT:

What does Jesus say about anything you have given up for Him?

Does this only apply to eternity or does it also refer to earthly success?

In what ways are you giving God the opportunity to reward you on earth and in eternity?

Day 3

And all those who had believed were together and had all things in common; and they began selling their property and possessions and were sharing them with all, as anyone might have need. - Acts 2:44-45

REFLECT:

Describe the church of Acts 2? Is giving out of your excess the same as giving of your own possessions?

In what ways do you strive to meet the needs of those around you?

Day 4

So then, none of you can be My disciple who does not give up all his own possessions. - Luke 14:33

REFLECT:

What does this verse mean?

What is your heart's viewpoint on your own possessions?

In what ways can you adjust your thoughts, mindsets and choices to better reflect the spirit of self-sacrifice Christ calls His followers to pursue?
