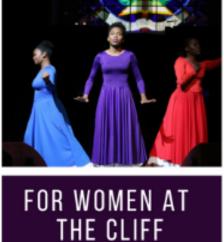
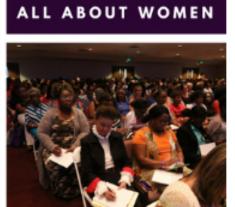

DON'T FORGET TO REMEMBER

There are times when our deepest hurts can consume us and cause us to become paralyzed. Unfortunately, when this happens, this can cause us to become "stunted or stuck due to a deep root of pain. Fear develops and then produces disobedience. That's what happened to me, until God reminded me of who I was.

In 2006, I felt one of the biggest pains I could ever imagine. It wasn't the bankruptcy, foreclosure, divorce or even failed attempts of reconciliation that

stumped me. It was Tuesday, November 14, 2006 that sent me into a state of shock – the day the husband, the one to whom I longed to be reconciled to, died.

Eventually, the days and nights of my tears being my food came to an end. I accepted God's sovereignty and love. His peace comforted me. His grace and mercy kept me in the midst of the pain. I was able to get back up, grow stronger, and keep moving. But something was still missing.

It has taken me about eleven years to admit that I've been hiding. Dreams, passions, goals and overall purpose have been tucked away, put on a back burner and even forgotten. Sure, there were glimpses here and there, but I have to be real – I forgot who I was. Because of the pain, I had become only a shell of all God had called me to be.

Awhile back, I was having coffee with a friend and in the context of our conversation about my "memory lapse," I was reminded of the story of Simba and Mufasa in Disney's The Lion King. Simba was an ambitious lion cub who would one day be king, but his father was killed while trying to save him. On top of that, an enemy had convinced Simba he was to blame. Dejected, ashamed and burdened by a painful past, he ran away and chose to forget what was supposed to be.

It only takes one story gone wrong to rock our worlds. For some it might be a natural disaster. For others it may be a death of a loved one, loss of possessions or positions. But don't forget to remember that our circumstances, situations, bad decisions, test and/or trials don't dictate who we are. Our core essence is tied to the God we serve and to the purpose that He placed in each of us before the very foundation of the earth. (Ephesians 2:10 NASB)

When we remember who God is, we easily remember who we are. Don't forget to remember! Unpack the pains that try to cover-up purpose by remembering that He is using it all for our good (Romans 8:28). Trust Him with it all to become your all.
