

# "Claiming Your Spiritual Rights"

Luke 13:10-17

### Introduction

Often, in the event of an unfortunate passing, there's an executor of the estate or legal representation entrusted to read a predetermined will. With heirs of the deceased member's family gathered, the executor will share the details for the distribution of personal belongings and ensure rightful inheritance to covenantal or legitimate beneficiaries. Much like the realities of this scenario, believers have authority, through Jesus, to claim promises and access their victory over illegitimate attacks from the enemy.

In Luke 13, Jesus encounters a woman at a synagogue plagued by demonic forces that have captivated her physical body for eighteen years, causing illness and limited mobility. While every physical ailment is not rooted in demonic influence, some are. Despite the woman's involvement and attendance in regular religious activities, the enemy physically controlled her. In verses 12 and 13, Jesus sees her and "He called her over and said to her, 'Woman, you are freed from your sickness.' And He laid His hands on her, and immediately she stood up straight again, and began glorifying God."

The direct presence of Jesus, His powerful words and His intimate touch freed the woman, and she overcame her spiritual attack. Engaging in a personal relationship with Jesus Christ is the means to taking ownership of your spiritual rights. Intentional proximity to Jesus brings power. Essentially, the closer you get to Jesus, the more power you receive to overcome emotional, physical and any other pain caused by illegitimate spiritual attacks.

Claiming spiritual rights also requires specific criteria. As a daughter of Abraham, the woman in Luke 13 possessed a covenantal position that gave her access to covenantal promises. As a believer, you also are a son or daughter of Abraham. You are connected to promises. Spiritual covenantal relationship through Jesus Christ is key. When you understand and claim your rightful victory over illegitimate spiritual battles, it emphasizes the reality that Satan has no authority over your life.

- **3.** Consider your relationship and proximity to Jesus. Do you recognize His presence? Do you spend time reading and obeying His Words? What steps do you need to take to draw closer to Him?
